Back home in March 2020, I was able to jump right into the business of Digitizing and Archiving Family Histories by converting 8mm/Super8 Home Movie Film, Video Tapes such as VHS - Hi8 - DV and Betamax to DVDs or MP4 Computer Files, as well as Digitizing old 35mm Slide Film to JPG or TIFF files, and Restoring Moldy Tapes and Film. Basically through word of mouth, I've been busy doing this for a full year now.

2020 Wedding Season

Filming weddings has been a key element for the business of *FREDA FILMS*. August 2020 provided the only wedding contract we had for the entire year, and we almost lost it. One week before the wedding day, Governor Baker reduced the allowed crowd limit to 50 guests due to COVID precautions. The Bridal Family was counting on 150 guests. They canceled their chosen venue and instead opted to host the ceremony and reception in their own backyard. But they had to cut out two-thirds of their guests - That was one tough decision for them. But the wedding was a huge success and our cinematic video production was as good as any we've done in the past. Nobody I know claimed to have been COVID sick from attending it.



Since then our wedding event schedule has pretty much dried up - so we continue on with other solutions...

Like <u>Digitizing Weddings</u> from long ago that have been stored for many ages on film or video tape. One of my clients was so thrilled to be able to watch for the first time, the 16mm Black & White film of her parents' Wedding from 1946 on her own TV Screen! How special was that! These events and stories are very rewarding and special to me which keep up my enthusiasm for making the transformations happen for people.

Like converting old film or video of loved ones who have passed away too soon and bringing memories of them back to life. Many of my clients say they'd waited for many years to digitize the content they had stored away and were ecstatic to finally get it done.

These topics drive me to preserve my own family histories for future generations. My only regret is that the home movie film I have of my grandparents from the 1950's do not have audio sound tracks, so their voices are not preserved. But at least seeing them on the screen is still a precious thing for me.

I try to connect my own daughters and grand-daughters to their family histories and also build, archive, and preserve their memories for future nostalgic recall.

One big plus during this pandemic has been a decision by my in-laws to rent a local Cinema Theater to celebrate a birthday and to show movies on the big screen. "Wonder Woman" was the first of 6 dates and it was a tremendous thrill for me to open the first Double-Feature with one of my own videos - the first time any of my films have Premiered on a BIG SCREEN in a Real Movie Theater with a Real Audience!

Before "Wonder Woman" began, I showed a brief musical documentary of my grand-daughter's basketball game highlights, which happened to be her best career game to date - It was a Smash Hit

And at home I digitized some 16mm soccer game film to show my grandkids how I scored the game-winning goal in 1971 to beat a team that had a 28-game unbeaten streak up to that point....

And my clients have been thrilled as well to see old content they hadn't seen in years, or had never seen before.

One asked me to digitize a film of Daily Life in Fitchburg, Massachusetts from 1941.









In between business projects, I have been converting all my own DVDs and Blu-ray family content to MP4 Computer Files that I can easily duplicate and share with as many people interested in them. Not only have I converted family videos, but also most of my educational videos produced while I was teaching.


